Clyde Heritage Precinct

The Clyde Heritage Precinct offers a glimpse into the past. Here, you can explore historic buildings and uncover stories from a former time. These historical buildings have been beautifully preserved to showcase the area's rich (literally and figuratively) history. These sites provide a reflective experience, allowing you to appreciate the architectural beauty and learn about life for the those who once called Clyde home.

You'll notice many old buildings are referred to as 'Dunstan', this is because the town was once called "The Dunstan" in the 1850s. When the goldfields where alive and thriving in the 1860's it became known as "Hartleys township" as he found gold here and many foreign travellers followed, hoping to strike it rich. Eventually, in 1864 it was officially and finally, named Clyde.

1. Dunstan House

A heritage hotel and cafe with stunning architecture, stone facade and wooden wrap around verandah. Address: 29 Sunderland Street, Clyde

2. Olivers + The Lord Clyde

Olivers - a stone beauty in the heart of Clyde, across from Dunstan House. Olivers and The Lord Clyde will leave a lasting impression on you. Whether it is their luxurious accomodations, awardwining restaurant or impressive apricottree filled cafe garden Merchant, you are sure to find a space to relax, unwind and take in the essence of this wonderful town.
